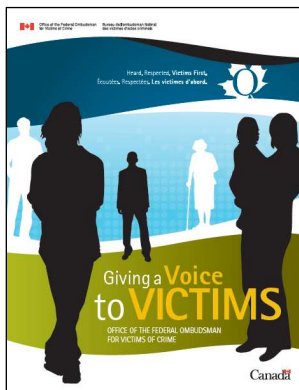

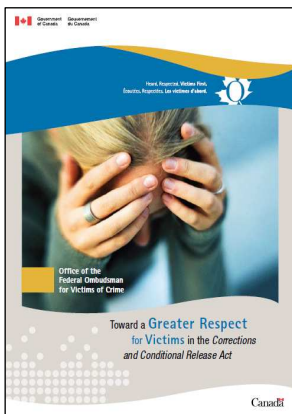
Shifting the Conversation

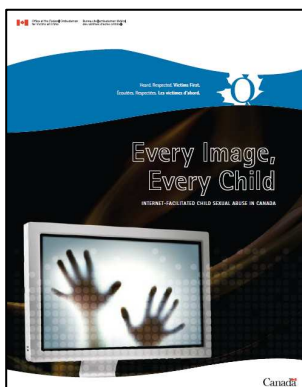
Toward a Greater Respect for Victims in the Corrections and Conditional Release Act
